If you can't lock it up inside, lock it down. Thread a heavy chain through both wheels and the frame, using a thick padlock.



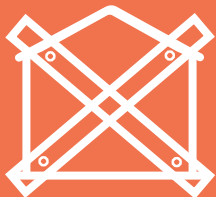
## Pool pumps
